Campus and Facilities | Set on 25 acres in suburban Rochester, New York, The Harley School campus features The Commons. Framed from a repurposed 19th century barn, this "living building" represents our commitment to sustainability. Opened in 2014, The Commons houses The Briggs Center for Civic Engagement, state-of-the-art science classrooms, a maker space, and the Center for Mindfulness and Empathy Education – home to Harley's hospice program. Adjacent to The Commons are an organic micro-farm and a greenhouse. Across campus, the Robert Lehman Visual Arts Center houses studio space, as well as a glass flameworking lab. Allens Creek, a campus boundary, offers opportunities for field study.
